






Which of these best describes how you feel about going to High School?



WHICH OF THESE BEST DESCRIBES HOW YOU FEEL ABOUT GOING TO HIGH SCHOOL?



Communication is vital

All staff at the High school are encouraged to converse regarding any successes or concerns about your child.

Your first port of call for most matters is the form tutor but all subject teachers are available for you to email too regarding subject specific questions. The School Councillor and I are also available.







BUT FIRST, HOW DO WE GET OUR CHILDREN THERE?

Drop off, pick up and supervision

- 7.45 start but traffic can be very busy at this time.
- School opens at 7am but there are no teachers supervising until
 7.30am
- We follow a one way system for drop off and pick as shown.
- The front parking lot is visitor and student parking.
- When approaching school, we ask that students prepare and gather their belongings: bag, water bottle etc.
- Please be mindful when stopping outside the admin building and move your car as far round as possible so as not to block other parents. It speeds things up for everyone.
- A member of staff is in the gazebo till 4.00 and the library is open until 4pm.



A day in the life...

Tutor time

- Your child's day begins promptly at 7.45am with their form tutor.
- This time is used for a whole range of things beyond taking attendance.
- Tutor time sets the tone for the rest of the day no matter what kind of morning they have had so far.
- Their tutor is the familiar face and the first port of call for both you and your children.
- In school your child's tutor will be the person who knows them best with an overview of their academic, social and personal profile.





EVERY CHILD MATTERS

During form and PSHE

Form tutors deliver activities that stimulate discussion and awareness of key issues and challenges that may not naturally fall inside the academic curriculum and help prepare them for their future.

A day in the life...

We operate a 2 week timetable which can seem confusing at first.

- A greater variety in the school day for students;

- There is greater flexibility for the school timetable so that a better balance can be achieved in terms of when and where lessons are placed;
- There is greater opportunity to broaden the curriculum for students.

Homework


What's the point of Homework?

Assessment and Reporting WHAT PROGRESS LOOKS LIKE...

Each subject tailors the way they assess the students.

Whilst some subjects are skills based and track improvement over time. Some subjects work module by module and assess knowledge on specific topics.

Each subject will have criteria that needs to be fulfilled in order to achieve a specific grade and students have acccess to this criteria.

If in doubt speak to the subject teacher.




