



Emotionally healthy students do better at school. To support their wellbeing, and allow space to discuss issues that could affect them now and in the future.


SKILL DEVELOPMENT

Importance of Year 10

- Each course is conducted over 5 terms. Three of which are in Year 10
- More exam content is covered in Year 10 than Year 11. Everything that is covered in every class could be on the final exam - attendance is key!
- Therefore, all students should be studying from the start of September in Year 10
- Exam technique and practice takes place throughout Years 10 and 11

HOW TO EXCEL IN EXAMS?

CREATING GOOD HABITS

- We have Study Skills lessons in Year 10 for students to consolidate the skills and techniques needed for effective revision.
- 'Little and often' is the key to effective revision i.e. revision should take place every day/week and not left to the end of the course or for exams.
- Repetition is extremely important.
- There is no 'one way' to revise but the 5-step approach that they have been taught earlier in the school is very important.
- Students should use their teachers and our learning support department for help with preparing for their exams.


Support for Learning


Equips students with the study skills to become independent lifelong learners.

EXAM SURVIVAL TIPS

HOW DO I HELP MY CHILD PREPARE FOR EXAMS?

- Help them set up a study schedule
- Provide a quiet place to study remove distractions!!
- Talk to them about what the are going to achieve in a study session and manage expectations.
- Check they have completed what they said they were going to
- Quiz them regularly on the content of the courses.
- Make sure they don't jump straight to exam practice, they need to do the revision first!
- Make sure they eat well.
- Make sure they sleep well.
- Help them keep calm panic is the enemy of exams.




