This half term we will be studying rivers. Using atlases, we will locate major rivers around the world and explain how they are important. In addition, we will identify different landforms relating to rivers and discuss flooding causes and preventions. We will particularly focus on the River Nile and the Aswan High Dam in Egypt.
